Chapter highlights

Introduction to FEniCS workshop

Date: February 10–12, 2020

Attendance: 15

At the beginning of the academic year 2019/2020 we started a transformation of our Chapter to include Czech Technical University in Prague as a partner institution. As a promising start of our future collaboration we organized together a three-day workshop on the basics of FEniCS – a computing platform for solving partial differential equations using the finite element method.

We introduced the participants to programming in Python and to the general principles of the finite element method. We successively presented 5 problems from solid mechanics providing their physical derivation as well as necessary mathematical background. The problems were implemented in FEniCS and solved together with the participants using the interactive web-based editor Jupyter Notebook. A detailed documentation was created for the purposes of the workshop, which should make organizing the event easier in the years to come.

The workshop attracted students from Charles University and Czech Technical University as well as people from non-academic environment. The feedback from participants was largely positive and we expect to continue organizing the workshop in the following years; possibly alternating between solid and fluid mechanics each year.

Report on other Chapter activities

Meeting with newcomer students

Date: September 30, 2019

Since the Faculty does not offer any orientation week for newcomer Master students, our meeting was organized to fill this gap, that is, to welcome the newcomer students and, primarily, to introduce them to the Student Information System of Charles University. We also informed them of important deadlines, which are due by the beginning of the academic year, as well as some school-related leisure activities, which could be of

their interest. We decided to cooperate with Matfyzák Society (website in Czech)—an association of students involved in organizing social events at the Faculty—on arranging the event in the following years.

Meeting with candidates applying for a research grant

Date: October 14, 2019

The Grant Agency of Charles University supports PhD students with their own research grants, however, the competition is tough. Every year, successful applicants from our Chapter in cooperation with the Academic Senate of the Faculty organize a meeting where we provide the potential applicants with advice on how to write a competitive grant application. Also, we invite the vice-deans and ex-members of the Grant Agency evaluation committee to help us highlight the important parts of the process. In fact, this annual event has a huge impact on the competition, as the quality of applications has significantly improved since we started organizing it.

SIAM SC seminar

Since the foundation of the Student Chapter at Charles University, we have organized a regular seminar with the aim to offer talks that are widely accessible to both students and teachers. Most of the speakers are PhD students, who try to introduce their field of research to an audience which is not particularly familiar with the subject. The seminars are held in a friendly atmosphere, with beverages and pizza served at the beginning. Ample time for formal as well as casual discussion is reserved during the seminar. Compared to the previous year, the seminar attracted more students from various departments of the Faculty, i.e. it has broaden its audience. It should be noted that the new students are excited by the idea of a joint, less formal, seminar and some even took the initiative to propose changes to the seminar's format that could prove beneficial. We plan to come to a conclusion about the future form of the seminar by the beginning of the next academic year. Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, only three seminars took place this year. (The last one just before lockdown already had poor attendance.)
